FIELD TRIPS

May 9, 10, & 11, Fri, Sat. & Sun. - Lafayette, LA - Lake Martin, St. Martinville, Avery Island.

Please note the change of dates. Originally planned for the first weekend in May. It turns out the original date is the Crayfish Festival so the motel rates are sky high and there will be crowds galore. So we will go the following weekend.

Lafayette, Louisiana is a 6 hour drive on I-20 East to Shreveport and then South on I-49 to Lafayette.

Acadian Village - Acadians from Nova Scotia came to the Lafayette area to escape British persecution in 1755. The French Acadians form the nucleus of the LA Cajuns. This is a restored 19th century Acadian Village made up of 8 authentic homes, general store, blacksmith's shop and chapel.

Lake Martin - One of the largest bird sanctuaries in the U.S. with a rookery of ibis, roseate spoonbills, herons, egrets and other water birds. You can drive on the levee and photograph the rookeries with a long lens.

St. Martinville - Longfellow-Evangeline state Commemorative Area is a 157-acre park, which has a reconstruction of a 19th century plantation. Henry Wadsworth Longfellow's poem, "Evangeline", told the story of the Acadians long struggle to find a new home and of Evangeline's 10-year search for her true love after their having been separated, only to find that he had married another.

Jungle Gardens on Avery Island. Where the sweeping curve of the Gulf of Mexico reaches the northern-most point of its arc, there is a plug of salt that is 8 miles deep, and at its tip, narrows to a circumference of 6 miles. This is hard to imagine, so try to picture this: If you fashioned a life-sized model of Himalayayan Mt. Everest of pure salt, it would be so much smaller than this plug of salt that there would be room to add a dozen or so major peaks of the Allegheny range. Only the upper most tip to this mountain projects above the reed-grown tide marshes. This is Avery island. Jungle Gardens has a 250-acre bird and animal sanctuary.
