Everyone can select several cacti to bring out of his greenhouse and set on the tables to photograph. Since cacti are notoriously late sleepers and often laugh at the photographer by refusing to flower in the sweet morning light, we will have to photograph them in the afternoon.

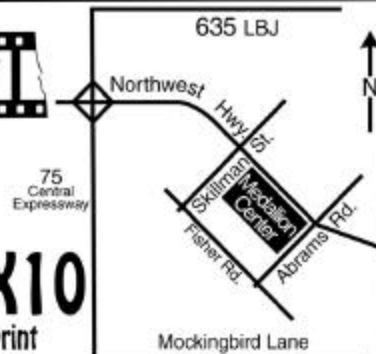
