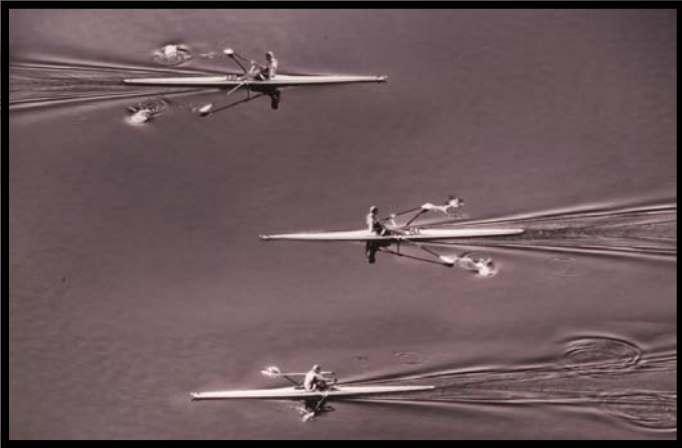
DUES ARE DUE!

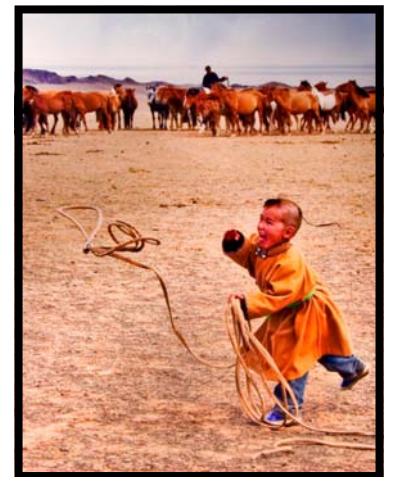

DALLAS CAMERA CLUB MEMBER'S 2005 ACCOMPLISHMENTS (CONTINUED)

Kaye Hargis - Kaye was notified in May of 2005 that two of her images were finalists in the 2004 Kodak National Park Contest. Her two images were two of 100 images selected as finalists out of 11,000 entries. She also was the Grand Prize Winner in the 2005 Feathers, Fur and Scales Photo Contest at the Dallas Zoo.

Paula Buzenius - Paula received two first place finishes in the Texas State Fair photography contest. One in "Black and White - Animals", Adult Division and the other in "Color Birds", Adult Division.

Eleanore Avery - Eleanore was very busy this year and it came with many awards and deserved recognition. In the 2005 Heard Nature Photo Contest, which receives entries from around the country, Eleanore placed first in "Wildlife" first place in "Nature Patterns" and first in "Artistic Nature". She received second and third places in "Scenics". She received a second place in "Shared World Scenic". She also received seven honorable mentions.

Eleanore placed first in the 2005 Nature's Best Photography magazine's annual contest which received 12,000 international entries. Her entry was first in the "Endangered Species" category and is on display at the Smithsonian Institute.

She was a top 10 finalist in the internationally submitted "Nature" category in the Smithsonian Annual Photo Contest. Over 6,000 international entries were submitted. Her image is displayed at the Smithsonian Institute.

A little closer to home, she placed first in the Gulf States Camera Club Council 2005 Color Print of the Year Award.

In Travel Photographer of the Year 2005 (International) Commended award, she placed 15th in the top 25 in Travelers Tales. She has 4 images on exhibit in London, England.

She received a PSA Green Eagle certificate for having 5 Green Eagle Awards for the best photos in traveling portfolio.

Eleanore has also given her time and images back to the photography community by serving as a judge in the Oklahoma International PSA Salon: Nature Prints and Slides. She was a featured presenter of "Iceland" show at GSCCC convention. She was a banquet guest presenter of "Africa" show at GSCCC. She also was a digital travel show presenter at Chicago chapter of PSA, Greater New Orleans Camera Club, and International Photography Hall of Fame Exhibit.

Clark Crenshaw - Besides traveling the country showing his photography at art shows and festivals last year, Clark received a first place in photography at the Rockport Arts Festival, a first place at Arts Festival Oklahoma, two first place winners on the Betterphoto.com website, six second place winners on the betterphoto.com website and a second place winner in the Peterson's Photographics monthly contest.

Neil D. Culver - Neil received 1st place in the novice division for his photograph of a ring-tailed lemur in the Dallas Zoo's photography contest; Feathers, Fur and Scales.

 Visitors are always welcome.

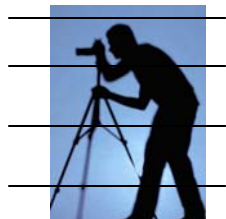
