Two days before we were scheduled to


leave for Ouray, Colorado to meet up with other DCC members, I took my 4-Runner in for an oil change. Twenty-four hours and \$3400 later I picked up said vehicle now with a rebuilt front end and new rear brakes, in addition to fresh crankcase oil. I'm not complaining, the better handling and braking came in very handy in the mountains.

Twenty DCC members made the trip.

Two couples pulled their own accommodations (trailers) while the rest of us stayed in various motels in Ouray. Sunday evening, we got together as a group for dinner at the Outlaw Restaurant and shared stories about where we had been and where we were going next.

The timing could not have been better





for brilliant fall color from the yellow Aspens. The magnificent scenery was only enhanced by fresh snowfall coating the peaks. The rain and melting snow did make getting around on the narrow mountain dirt roads a little more challenging (I was forced to turn around several times to avoid getting stuck or worse) but those willing and able to brave the muddy conditions were rewarded with spectacular images. In addition to mountain peaks and bright yellow leaves, some of our group visited Great Sand Dunes National Park, Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Park, and Mesa Verde National Park. Others took the gondola ride in Telluride to get even higher and some spent time on the Durango & Silverton Railroad watching the landscape go by and not worrying about driving off a cliff. #### Storyboard - Plano Balloon Festival - September 24, 2022



On a nice balmy Saturday evening the Plano Balloon Festival at Oak Pont Park showcased its Evening Glow to the delight of over a few thousand spectators. The scene resembled more of a State Fair Midway than the docile balloon events attended previously. The que of cars extended for a couple of miles before the entrance to the park could be interred. There was a fairly long walk to the open field where the activities began. People brought children, blankets and chairs with them.

Folks lined up to pay for entrance to the enclosed arena but many chose to spread their blankets and chairs on the rise overlooking the spectacle. Even before entering the field the live music could be heard and the tops of the inflating balloons could be seen.





Concessions offered State Fair-like food and beverages. There were several kid's rides and attractions, too. Kids and adults were dancing, individually, before the band's stage to the sound of rock music, some videoing themselves – all with smiles on their faces.





Hal Sommer and Jay Hoppenstein were almost the only members of the huge crowd carrying digital cameras; most of the others had their smart phones out creating photographs or videos of the events.

Despite the number of people present

it was not too difficult to find a place at the fence that separated the crowd from the balloon field. From this vantage point there were no people between the cameras and the evolving balloon inflations which were about 50 to 150 yards away. Balloons were being inflated by the use of large ground, electrical fans and the ignition of the "burners" which were initially





placed horizontally.

Gradually, the balloons took shape, some as conventional, inverted tearlike shapes but others when inflated became fantastic resemblances of animals, cartoon character and a multitude of other forms. All were colorful but their brilliance did not fully manifest itself until the sun dipped below the horizon.

Then, as the white, orange and blue flames heated and made buoyant the air entering the balloon's opening, the balloons rose and began to glow, radiating all of their colors. As the evening darkened the glow became a beautiful array of color. The burning of the gas had to be controlled to be just enough to inflate the balloons but not so much as to cause a balloon to strain uncontrolla-


bly against its tethers. The ignitions were turned on and off creating a view of flashing lights throughout the park.

When total darkness enveloped the

park an announcer choreographed the balloons' glow cycle as well as the crowds' activation of their phone's flashlights. He had the ballooners ignite their burners and turn them off on his command. He also had them "twinkle" – randomly "flash" their burners creating a sparkling-like effect.



The show was entertaining and worth the effort to be there. We returned

home with our memory cards filled with colorful, dynamic images.



landscapes, places and things.






