### Past Field Trip: Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge - December 13, 2025

WHAT: Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge

WHERE: Lake Texhoma

WHEN: Saturday December 13, 2025

Saturday, December 13th started early for members of at least three different photography clubs and a very good dog at Hagerman National Wildlife Refuge on Lake Texoma. It was a bit cold but dry and there was little wind. The sunrise, as usual, was on time but not spectacular. Thanks to the magic of digital processing, it was well worth getting up for.

A flock of approximately 8000 Snow geese was easily found and attracted a hoard of photographers with very long lenses. The birds were content to mill around in the field, squabble with their neighbors, and chow down on the succulent forage provided by the refuge. With some patience, shooters were rewarded with ample "birds in flight" photos. Driving around the many roads to the drilling pads (the refuge is an active fossil fuel production site) produced still more images of myriad water birds and other wildlife. All in all, a very nice day to be out in nature with friends.

One of my favorite things about organizing club field trips has been to introduce folks to new places and photographic possibilities. This outing was no exception. In addition to the refuge (which is a great place to visit any time of the year) we enjoyed Huck's Catfish Restaurant for lunch (I had the best chicken fried steak I've had in the 25+ years of living in Dallas), and Ironroot Distillery.

### Past Field Trip: Caddo Lake - November 7-9, 2025

Dallas Camera Club members photographed wildlife and landscape in the Texas swamps

WHAT: Caddo Lake Fall Color

WHERE: Uncertain, TX

WHEN: November 7-9, 2025

Caddo Lake is one of Texas' few natural lakes. Some say the only one. Lodging and boat rentals are centered around the tiny town of Uncertain, Texas - population count was 85 during the 2020 census. Caddo Lake is on the Texas—Louisiana border about 3 hours, 170 miles east of Dallas. It has diverse aquatic plant life and wildlife in a bald cypress swamp. It is home to 190 species of trees and bushes and more than 220 kinds of birds.

Little did I know that Caddo Lake had become an international destination for photographers seeking Fall foliage. There were half a dozen photo workshops at the lake while we were there - each charging \$3000 to \$6000 not including transportation. Lodging and photo boats were being booked by these groups back in March.

There were 25 photographers from the club that participated in our field trip. They were treated to a unique experience. The field trip revolved around photo boat cruises at sunrise and sunset. We had 3 pontoon boats and took 4 boat trips, each was different. Of course, one never knows what nature will have in store when you start planning a trip 8 months in advance.

We had a 2 hour sunset photo boat ride on Friday evening. The light was a little flat and the clouds limited the sunset, but we got an opportunity photograph from the boats and learn about our equipment. And, we all came back with some good photographs to start the weekend.

Saturday morning was completely fogged-in with maybe 20' visibility as we left the marina. The fog stayed with us until we returned about 10am. This was a great opportunity to photograph the lake and trees in the fog. Many from our group headed off to the Shady Grove Cafe for coffee and a hot breakfast.

The fog lifted early afternoon and we left the marina a little after 2pm for a beautiful sunlit afternoon shoot. This provided an opportunity to explore the bayous in the cypress swamp. The clouds cooperated and provide a nice sunset.

A norther was headed in as we left the marina to photograph the sunrise on Sunday morning. We had enough wind to add wavelets to the surface. A beautiful sunrise developed with silhouetted cypress in the foreground. We took advantage of the rest of the morning light to photograph plants, flowers and birds. We were glad to be heading back to the marina as the wind was building and the temperature dropping. Back to the cafe for hot coffee and breakfast.

It seemed that Caddo Lake State Park was a favorite destination when we were not on the water. The lovely Saw Mill Pond had a good stand of cypress that still had red leaves. There were two piers and trails around the pond that provided good photo platforms. Canoers and kayakers added color. In addition to the pond, the Big Cypress Bayou ran through the park. It was once the main waterway that connected Port Jefferson to Shreveport.

We met for dinner at the Big Pines Lodge just outside of Uncertain after the sunset photo cruise on Saturday evening. Catfish and beer seemed to be popular with our group.

The group seemed to have a good time. We got to know some of the fellow club members better and came home with great photos of Caddo Lake and East Texas. The 10 minute field trip video provides a sampling of photos from Caddo and is available on the club website.

WHAT: A day out with friends

WHERE: Cedar Hill State Park and DFW National Cemetery

WHEN: Saturday January 17th (weather permitting)

Start your New "Photography" Year off with the January DCC outing just southwest of Dallas at the DFW National Cemetery (Dallas-Fort Worth National Cemetery - National Cemetery Administration) and Cedar Hill State Park (Cedar Hill State Park — Texas Parks & Wildlife Department). Plan to meet up at 9 AM at the Park entrance. In addition to lake views and nature trails, Penn Farm Agricultural History Center offers many photo opportunities within the park. You can easily visit the cemetery either before the State Park or after lunch on your way home.

"In 1854, John Anderson Penn settled in the rugged, cedar-covered hills of southwest Dallas County, an area known as the Cedar Mountains. Today, remnants of the original Penn Farm survive intact in Cedar Hill State Park.

Penn Farm Agricultural History Center pays tribute to the disappearing Texas family farm. It offers a glimpse into rural life, when farm machinery took the place of the horse and mule almost a century ago. The center is open daily for self-guided tours. It features reconstructed and historic buildings from the mid-1800s through the mid-1900s."



#### Roaming Mexico: Laura Wilson

on exhibit at Meadows Museum through January 11, 2026

For four decades, the wilds of the American West have served as a key source of inspiration for renowned Dallas-based documentary photographer Laura Wilson (b. 1939). Her images of the people living and working "out west" ("out" meaning removed from modern American life) on ranches, Native American reservations, rodeos, and rural high schools are intimate yet distant. Indeed, as ever, the West is populated with characters defined by their distance, by their landsapes and lifeways that stand in sharp contrast to the familiar claustrophobia of urban and suburban America. There is, likewise, a kind of otherworldiness to Wilson's West; it is a marginal (if nested place. Her images resdie "on the edge," to paraphrase the renowened historian of medieval art Michael Camille, and we imagine the person behind the lens herself straddling the boundary

Color slides were added, presumably in the 1940s, and color print competitions were added in 1970. In 1998, images from digital files were first accepted into DCC competitions. In 2005, slides were combined with projected digital images to create the projected images category. Slides were eliminated in 2008. Club competitions are now focused on color prints, monochrome prints and digital projected images.

The objective of the club is "the mutual entertainment and education of its members in all forms of amateur photographic art." The DCC hosts contests and events including monthly competitions, field trips, workshops, programs of general interest, an awards banquet and an annual competition (the "Bird") between DCC and Fort Worth Camera Club members. The DCC emphasizes intra-club competition as a learning process. Importance is placed on helping the beginner or new member feel at ease, ask questions, learn and participate.


