

8 TIPS FOR BEING A MORE SUCESSFUL PHOTOGRAPHER


IN GENERAL

- 1. KNOW YOURSELF
- 2. KNOW YOUR EQUIPMENT
- **3.** SEE LIKE A CAMERA*
- 4. STUDY THE WORK OF OTHERS (NOT JUST PHOTOGRAPHERS)
- 5. TAKE LOTS OF PICTURES AND STUDY THE RESULTS
 - 1. JOIN A TEN SHOT PROGRAM
- 6. HANG AROUND WITH FOLKS THAT KNOW MORE THAN YOU DO
- 7. MAKE PHOTOGRAPHS ABOUT THINGS RATHER THAN JUST PICTURES OF THINGS
- 8. ASK FOR HELP/CRITICISM
- 9. REPEAT

EYE vs CAMERA

- ENVIRONMENT: MULTI DIMENTIONAL vs 2D
- FOCUS: CONTINOUS CENTER WEIGHTED vs FIXED PLANE
- DYNAMIC RANGE: TREMENDOUS vs LIMITED
- FOCAL LENGTH: FIXED vs CHANGABLE
- OPERATIONAL SPEED: CONTINOUS VERY FAST vs EPISODIC VARIABLE
- METADATA: SUBJECTIVE & OBJECTIVE vs ONLY OBJECTIVE

- **1. PHOTOGRAPHY IS SOMETHING WE DO FOR FUN**
- 2. CONTEST PHOTOS ARE ONLY A SMALL & SPECIALIZED PART OF OUR TOTAL OUTPUT
 - 1. PROJECTS, BOOKS, WEBSITE, SOCIAL MEDIA, EXHIBITS, FAMILY ALBUMS.....
- 3. WE ASK JUDGES TO RANK ORDER OUR SUBMISSIONS
- 4. GENERALLY, WINNING IMAGES
 - **1. HAVE OBVIOUS AND INTERESTING MAIN SUBJECTS**
 - 2. WERE TECHNICALLY WELL MADE AND FLAWLESSLY PROCESSED
 - **3. WERE ILLUMINATED WITH EXQUISITE LIGHT**
- 5. A CONTEST JUDGE'S OPINION IS BUT A SINGLE DATA POINT

INTRINSIC MOTIVATION

MAKE YOURSELF HAPPY

- PHOTOGRAPH WHAT YOU CARE ABOUT
 - IF YOU DO NOT REALLY CARE ABOUT YOUR SUBJECT, NO ONE ELSE WILL
- USE THE TOOLS AND TECHNIQUES AVAILABLE TO YOU TO SHOW THAT YOU CARE
 - THINK OF EACH IMAGE AS A STORY AND YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR TELLING IT
- WHEN SHARING WORK, KNOW YOUR AUDIENCE
 - REALIZE THAT EACH VIEWER WILL HAVE THEIR OWN INTERPRETATION
 - SHOW ONLY YOUR BEST
 - DO NOT TAKE IT BADLY IF OTHERS DO NOT AGREE
 - LEARN FROM IT

THE LEAST INPORTANT THING YOU WILL EVER GET OUT OF A CONTEST IS THE SCORE!

- 1. REMEMBER WHY YOU ARE DOING THIS
 - **1. YOU ENJOY PHOTOGRAPHY, IT MAKES YOU HAPPY...**
- 2. CONTEST JUDGES ARE SUPPOSED TO RANK ORDER THE ENTRIES
 - **1. THEY ARE FORCED TO PICK WINNERS**
 - 2. THAT DOES NOT MAKE YOU A LOSER!
- **3. PAY ATTENTION TO JUDGES COMMENTARIES**
- 4. CREATE CONTEST SPECIFIC IMAGES
- 5. DON'T WAIT TO SELECT ENTRIES
- 6. SET REALISTIC GOALS

REMEMBER WHY YOU DOING THIS

- YOU ENJOY TAKING PICTURES
- YOU WANT TO SHARE YOUR WORK WITH OTHERS
- YOU WANT FEEDBACK
- YOU WANT TO LEARN



DCC JUDGING AND AWARDS

- The competition chairpersons will select photographers from outside the club to judge entries. The judges are asked to evaluate images based on impact, composition and technical merit. Competition scores may range from 65 100 based on the general criteria below. A score of 75 is considered to be a good image.
- 95 100: Exceptional 90 94: Superior

 - 85 89: Excellent
 - 80 84: Commendable
 - 75 79: Above Average
 - 70 74: Average
 - 65 69: Below Standard

CONTEST JUDGES ARE SUPPOSED TO RANK ORDER THE ENTRIES

• PPC

- Judge's Points (also called Image Points) are awarded by the judge based solely on the merits of the image and not in competition with other images. The judge considers impact, composition, and the technical aspects of the image in determining the point value. No image scores less than 6 points, and the maximum number of points is 15.
- Place Points are awarded for 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Honorable Mention (HM) in each Level. The point values are:
- First Place 10
- Second Place 6
- Third Place 3
- Honorable Mention

CONTEST JUDGES ARE SUPPOSED TO RANK ORDER THE ENTRIES

- **1. REMEMBER THAT CONTESTS ARE BUT A SMALL PART OF YOUR PHOTOGRAPHY**
 - 1. YOU ARE YOUR PRIMARY AUDIENCE: MAKE YOURSELF HAPPY MOST OF THE TIME
 - 2. FOR A CONTEST, MAKE THE JUDGE HAPPY
- 2. DO NOT LET A CONTEST JUDGE BE THE FIRST PERSON TO SEE YOUR ENTRY
 - 1. ASK OTHERS (NOT YOUR MOTHER) FOR ADVICE
- **3. DO NOT GIVE THE JUDGE ANYTHING NOT TO LIKE**
 - 1. ELIMINATE FLAWS SUCH AS NOISE, DISTRACTIONS, HORIZONS, EXPOSURE, LACK OF SHARPNESS
- 4. MAKE IT SIMPLE AND EASY FOR THE JUDGE
 - 1. AN IMPACTFUL IMAGE WITH A CLEAR FOCAL POINT SUPPORTED BY THE OTHER ELEMENTS WITHIN THE FRAME, PROVIDE A SIMPLE DISCRIPTIVE TITLE

- MAKE A FOLDER ON YOUR DESKTOP FOR POTENTIAL CONTEST ENTRIES
- KEEP THE LIST OF CONTEST THEMES (SUBJECTS) WITH YOU FOR REFERENCE
- MAKE AN EFFORT TO PHOTOGRAPH OFTEN AND LOOK FOR CONTEST IMAGES
- MAKE PHOTOGRAPHS ABOUT THINGS RATHER THAN JUST OF THINGS (SNAPSHOTS)



A SECOND CHANCE

DON'T WAIT TO SELECT ENTRIES

- SELECT AND PREPARE IMAGES WELL IN ADVANCE OF DUE DATES
 - GIVE YOURSELF TIME TO GET FEEDBACK AND MAKE CHANGES
- CONSIDER ENTERING IMAGES MONTHS AHEAD OF TIME (PLACE HOLDERS?)*
 - ENTER EVERY CONTEST, YOU WILL LEARN SOMETHING (AND THAT'S WHY YOU ARE DOING THIS)
- IF YOU STRUGGLE TO PICK AN ENTRY FROM MANY POSSIBILITIES, FLIP A COIN
 - YOU CAN ALWAYS ENTER THE OTHERS IN LATER CONTESTS
