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### Call for Images: "The BIRD" Competition

### "The BIRD"

The Emily Guthrie Smith Award, affectionately referred to as "The BIRD", has been awarded to the winner of The BIRD competition most every year since 1964 in October or early November. There are two years when either the contest wasn't held or records are missing. It's always been Dallas Camera Club vs. Fort Worth Camera Club and attending The BIRD is a great opportunity to meet fellow neighbor photographers.

Each camera club submits their members best 30 images including 15 prints (color or monochrome) and 15 projected images. The prints are judged

real-time at the meeting by a panel of judges. The club with the most points at the end of the evening wins and holds onto The BIRD trophy until next year.

### "The BIRD" Today

On October 28, 2025 Dallas Camera club is competing in The BIRD Competition, our friendly annual competition between our club and the Fort Worth Camera Club. This year will be our first victory since 2006 or our 18th consecutive loss

We can't win without YOU! We need your "best of the best" images! We have access to your monthly entries already, no need to send them in again, but we want to see what else you have that might help bring "The Bird" home!

In addition to sending in up to 5 images through the club's competition system we'd also love it if you would share with us a link to where we can see your work. A lot of club members showcase their work on personal websites, social media, and on sites like SmugMug, 500px, Flickr, and more. If you have your images online somewhere, send the link to <a href="steve@makeshiftphoto.com">steve@makeshiftphoto.com</a>. Sometimes we don't recognize the competitiveness of some of our own work, and giving us a peek at the work you're proud enough to share online might prove to be just the edge we need to reverse our current long streak of bad luck!

#### **Dallas Camera Club Members:**

Submit up to five (5) of your best images to the "BIRD Candidates 2025" competition on the club's website. (You may have to scroll down the competition list to find it). Submission deadline: September 30, 2025. Put "print" in the image's title if available as a print.

The Bird Competition is an open-themed contest (not just a competition of bird photos). This year, the competition will be hosted by the Dallas Camera Club on Tuesday, October 28, 2025 at Northaven United Methodist Church, 11211 Preston Rd • Dallas, TX 75230. The contest will begin at 7:00 pm.

Each club will enter a total of 30 images (15 projected and 15 prints.) Any single member in good standing may have a total of two entries: one projected and one print. Participation in monthly club competitions is not required.

Entries will be selected by Steven and Erin Reeves (DCC Bird Competition Coordinators) and a select group of other DCC members.

Images selected for the print division will need to be produced by the maker or by another entity under their supervision as permitted under the rules.

Please submit your entries through the club's competition system on our website. You will find the "BIRD Candidates 2025 - Print and Projected" contest listed among the monthly entries. Please note: The deadline to submit your five best images is 11:59pm on September 30, 2025. When submitting your entries, please let us know if your image is available as a print by including the word "print" in the title.

### Some "POINTERS"

**Strong technical achievement** - Entries need to be sharp where they're supposed to be sharp, well exposed, and free from obvious processing errors.

**Thoughtful Composition** - Images need to be free of clutter and distracting elements. Great composition makes it obvious what the image is about. Anything in an image that doesn't help it, hurts it. Judges view and score images within a few seconds. The "story" of an image needs to be told instantly through its composition.

*Impact* - As others have said in the past, the three most important parts of a photo are: Impact, Impact, and Impact. Due to the nature of this type of competition, subtle, beautifully made contemplative photos don't get the chance to succeed that one would hope for. Vibrant, dynamic, SIMPLE images that can pack a punch in a very short period of time typically do better. Projected images work best when they are horizontal as they fill the large projection screen.

A special note regarding the impact of print entries: prints, even at the maximum 20" x 24" size, are viewed from a distance and are postage-stamp-sized to the judges compared to the size of projected images. The need for vibrant, exciting and SIMPLE images *is even greater for prints as a result.* 

**PRINTS** - If one of your images is selected to be part of Dallas Camera Club's 15 PRINT entries, we will contact you to make arrangements to receive your print. The contest allows printed images to be up to 20" x 24".

### **Getting Ready for "The BIRD" Competition**

Now is the time to start thinking about which of your images will help us beat the Fort Worth Camera Club



The page at right from the August 2004 issue of *Thru The Lens* is a good reminder that now is a great time for members to start reviewing their photo library and selecting their best images for consideration to be included among DCC's official entries into "The BIRD" competition. Export images at the same file size as DCC monthly competitons require.

The Emily Guthrie Smith Award, affectionately referred to as "The BIRD", competition has been held each year since 1964 between the Dallas Camera Club and Fort Worth Camera Club. "The BIRD" is a perpetual trophy that has each year's winner's name engraved on it. The competition is held in October or early November and rotated between the clubs each year. This is a great opportunity to meet our neighbor photographers. Each club submits 15 color or monochrome prints and 15 projected images to be judged real-time at the meeting by a panel of judges. The club with the most points wins and will get to keep the trophy, affectionately known as "The BIRD" for the next year.

The following are the mutually agreed upon guidelines for the competition.

#### General


- 1. The location of the competition will alternate between clubs each year and will be held in October or early November.
- 2. The host club sets the date and time approximately two months prior to the event and notifies the visiting club.
- 3. The host club will provide facilities, necessary scoring and presentation equipment, score sheets and three judges for the competition.
- 4. Directions to the meeting (competition) site are given on the host's website or will be provided.
- 5. The prior year's winner will bring the Bird trophy to the competition with the engraving updated.

#### Preparation, delivery and presentation of images

- 1. Each club will submit 15 prints (monochrome or color) and 15 digital projected images.
- 2. No more than one print and one projected image may be entered by a single maker.
- 3. No image may have been entered in prior D/FW Interclub competitions.
- 4. The host club's regular competition rules for size, preparation and presentation of images, as found on its website, will govern except that prints may conform to either club's regular print size limits.
- 5. Labeling images
  - Each print will be labeled on the back in the upper left corner identifying the club, order to be shown, maker and image title, e.g. FWCC3, My Name, Image Title.
  - Each projected image's file name will include the club, order to be shown, maker and image title, e.g. DCC7 My Name Image Title, ipg.
- Lists, for both prints and projected images, with maker's names, image titles and presentation order will be provided to the host club prior to the meeting.
- 7. Delivery of images
  - The visiting club will bring their prints to the competition.
  - The visiting club's projected images will be provided to the host club several days prior to the meeting.
- 8. The host club's images will be randomly interspersed with the visiting club's entries maintaining the desired presentation order of each club.
- 9. The host club will make up score sheets with all images listed in the order to be shown. At least four copies will be provided to the visiting club.
- 10. The host club will provide a digital projector and screen for the digital projected images.
- 11. Displaying and judging print images
  - The host club will provide a light stand for the prints.
  - Judges will view the prints at no more than an arm's length distance
  - Simultaneously, digital images of the prints will be available to be viewed via Zoom.
  - Judges will judge solely from the print.
  - Winning images (at a minimum) will be displayed for the audience to view.

#### Judging and awards

- 1. The competition will be judged real-time. The host club will provide three judges who are not current or recent members of the host club.
- Images will be introduced by title as they are presented to the judges.
- 3. The scores of each judge will be added together to determine the final score of each image. Judges may re-score images at their discretion prior to the end the competition.
- 4. The host club will provide the scoring system. Each club will provide one official scorekeeper. The club with the highest combined score for prints and projected images will be the winner of The BIRD for the year.
- 5. The judges will select 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Honorable Mention winners for both prints and projected images. The host club will provide awards for all winners.



Now is the time to review your photo library and select your best images to be considered for inclusion in DCC's official entries for "The BIRD" Competition October 28, 2025. See website for the image submission process.

### Past Field Trip: Haas Moto Museum - August 16, 2025 Dallas Camera Club photographed the motorcycle collection at the Haas Moto Museum Dallas Camera Club

#### AUGUST FIELD TRIP REPORT: HAAS MOTO MUSEUM

Did you ever want to own a motorcycle? Do you own one now? Dallas businessman, Bobby Haas, didn't ride his first motorcycle until he was 64. He was hooked, and soon after, "Bobby," as he was known, started collecting one of a kind, rare and artistic motorcycles. In the span of only 5 years, Bobby amassed over 230 motorcycles from 13 decades that now occupy the 20,000 square foot museum that bears his name, the Haas Moto Museum, in Addison, TX. The artwork in Haas Moto Museum isn't limited to motorcycles. There are lots of drawings, posters, and metal art on display as well. They have a shop where Sparky, the museum engineer, works on restoring and updating bikes. In the shop, you will find photography books by Bobby from his time as an aerial photographer for National Geographic magazine.

On Saturday, August 16, approximately 30 members of the Dallas Camera Club walked through the doors of the museum and began to photograph Bobby's passion. There are racing bikes, show bikes, bikes with side cars, bikes with elaborate designs, Harley Davidson, Indian, Norton, BMW, and other classic motorcycles. There are motorcycles of all types and sizes in the museum, and our members were fully engaged in photographing every aspect of these two wheeled, and sometimes three wheeled treasures. There's even a replica of what may be the most famous motorcycle ever: "Captain America." the motorcycle Peter Fonda rode in the classic movie from 1969, "Easy Rider." I don't think there is an official count, but I wouldn't be surprised if Captain America wasn't the most photographed motorcycle of the day. I know it was for me. An added bonus for this August field trip was that it was indoors and the air conditioning kept everyone out of the hot Texas weather!

After about an hour and a half of taking pictures of these treasures, 27 or so headed just a short 5 minutes away to Rodeo Goat for some lunch and fellowship. Motorcycles were discussed, as were future and individual plans for trips for, what else, taking pictures!

WHERE: DOWNTOWN DALLAS

WHEN: 9 AM SATURDAY, September 6, 2025

Historic Downtown Dallas offers a perfect venue for capturing a wide variety of photographic subjects. In addition to Street Photography and Architectural Photography, you should be able to add club contest themed images (View Though a Portal, Bird's Eye View, and Shallow Depth of Field) to your catalogue. This FT should be an excellent opportunity for members to learn from each other while strolling the sidewalks of the downtown area.

For those that wish to travel as a group I suggest we begin at 9 AM at Thanks-Giving Square. From there we will proceed down Ervay St. past Neiman Marcus and the J. Erik Jonson Public Library to Dallas City Hall. From there we will head west along Young St. through Pioneer Plaza then make a right turn to go along S. Griffin St. before taking another right on Jackson St. which will get us to the AT&T Discovery District. Plan on lunch at around 11:30 AM in the Exchange Food Hall (208 S. Akard St.).

Anyone who would rather wander and shoot on their own, feel free. There is no obligation to join the herd. Downtown Dallas is full of photo ops, so, take your time and enjoy the scene. The AT&T Discovery District website (Home | Dallas, Texas | AT&T Discovery District (att.com)) has information on parking. If you want to take DART (DART), you can get on and off the train near Thanks-Giving Square (The Thanks-Giving Foundation – Coming together on Common Ground, moving together to Higher Ground (thanksgiving.org))





**NOVEMBER FIELD TRIP**

WHAT: DCC Caddo Lake Fall Color

WHERE: Caddo Lake, Uncertain, TX

WHEN: Friday, November 7 - Sunday, November 9, 2025

The Dallas Camera Club is going to Caddo Lake this year for its annual Fall Color field trip. It has been almost 10 years since the club last visited Caddo Lake, so many members may not be familiar with the lake. Here is a short introduction. For more details, see the links at the end of this article.

Caddo Lake is one of Texas' few natural lakes. Some say the only one. It is also one of 27 wetlands in the US recognized by Ramsar Convention. Lodging and boat rentals are centered around the tiny town of Uncertain, Texas, population less than 100. Caddo Lake is on the Texas-Louisiana border about 3 hours east of Dallas. It has diverse aquatic plant life and wildlife in a bald cypress swamp with a bottomland hardwood forest. It is home to 190 species of trees and shrubs, 22 species of amphibians, 47 mammal species and more than 220 kinds of birds. Over 40 of the native bird species are endangered. Here are a few photos from around the lake.



### LOCATION:

The red arrow on the map below points to Caddo Lake. Uncertain, Tx will be our destination to get to Caddo. It is 170 miles from Dallas taking I20 and it takes about 3 hours to get there.



Fall color is becoming a really big deal at Caddo with photographers coming from all over the US. Groups are already booking lodging and boats.

The club has booked 3 boats which will hold a total of 22 photographers. These boats will be available for all 4 scheduled cruises on a first come basis. If the need exists, we will try to find more boats. The boats are 20', 22' and 24' pontoon boats. Boats will all leave from, or near to, the Johnson Ranch Marina.

There are only two small motels in Uncertain which describe themselves as lodges, inns or resorts - the Uncertain Lodge and Inn, and the Shady Glade Resort. There are a few 2 to 5 unit "motels" as well. The State Park also has cabins and campgrounds (these can only be booked 5 months in advance). Other cabins and houses in town are available as well. You will need to make you own arrangements for your party.

Our field trip revolves around photo boat cruises at sunrise (6:40 am) and sunset (5:20 pm). The big picture plan is below. We will put times on these activities as we get closer to the field trip.

The area around Uncertain is shown in more detail below. The main objective is photographing from a boat out on the lake. There are other interesting things around Uncertain to checkout during the day on Saturday or coming or going. These include canoeing or kayaking on the lake, the shoreline around Uncertain, Caddo Lake State Park, Caddo Lake State Wildlife Management Area, Caddo Lake National Wildlife Refuge, and Jefferson, TX.



We will have dinner at the Big Pines Lodge just outside of Uncertain on Saturday evening after the sunset photo cruise.

In summary, we are going to Caddo Lake November 7-9, 2025 during peak fall color. So are a lot of other photographers from near and far. We have 3 pontoon boats reserved. Lodging accommodations will fill up long before November. Most of the motels and cottages have reasonable cancellation policies, so book early if you are planning to go. There is more information on the website and I will keep you informed as more information becomes available.



#### **Lunch Stories with Ron**

Recently. I sat down to lunch with a man who told me he joined the Air Force the day after the Korean War started; that he was an Architect in Construction and General Management and visited Iraq many times to oversee factory construction. As Iraq invaded Kuwait, he sent a coded message to his contractors: "sending a case of beer with the next food shipment". Which meant: "get out now". As the two workers drove towards Jordan they were denied entry because they had no Visas. Eventually, they traded their car for passage. The boss approved and welcomed them home.

And we had not even ordered our appetizers yet! This man is full of stories and shared so many over lunch with his lovely wife, Shirley, and good friend. Irwin Lightstone. But his favorite times are those of being a photographer. I introduce to you, Ron Marabito, a Heard Nature Photographers Lifetime Member and club Officer for many years, as well as being an intrepid mentor, traveler, storyteller and camera man.


Ron was born in Ohio in 1932 and now a man of 93 who has endured double by-pass surgery in 1995 and a stroke in 2018. He had the stroke in his front yard, just after returning from White Sands National Park on a photo trip. Priorities, he said. One must travel and make photographs.

#### **Professional Architect**

In the 50s he was an architecture student at UT Austin and later married and moved to Dallas. In 1964 he became a licensed architect and headed the Construction Management and Technology Department at Richland College. He was a General Contractor from 1978-85 and a licensed interior designer since the 90s. He told me that he was not really interested in photography. but it became a necessity since he needed to document the many buildings he designed. He used 35mm cameras as well as medium format cameras. This was in the days of film and everything was processed at BWC in Dallas.





#### The RV Life

Rumor has it that Ron retired six differnt times. He took every retirment opportunity as as adventure. In the 60s Ron and Shirley purchased a motor home and began traveling in north America. visiting all fifty states except Rhode Island and all Canadian Provinces except the Northwest Territory. He said traveling in their successive motor homes clocked about 200,000 on vacations. Although the motor home did not travel to Mexico, Germany, Greece or Iraq, Ron looked at everything with a new eye and started to take lots of photos. He began documenting their travels with hopes of reliving these trips long after they were over. And then Ron got serious about his image-making.

I found Ron on RV Forum, which they joined in 2005 to share their travels with others. He is credited with showing a slide presentation of his photos many evenings at various campgrounds. Someone else was delighted with purchasing one of his photos and another says "He can manipulate an image like no one else. He had many a "show" during past RV Forum Rallies." Someone else remembers he rented a yellow jeep to tool around taking photos and another says his solution to air his RV brakes was excellent. He reminded everyone that he was the most senior member among them and still out RVing.

And when Ron was not out RVing, he was on the forum discussing cameras and photography: "Ultimately, most of my shots are gut feel and not always real technical. Afterall, it's what comes out at the end that is important. Also nice is the fact that we have software today capable of salvaging a lot of bad image taking and make good image taking rewarding."

We are finished with the entrée now and the waitress asks if we want dessert. We are full, have lemonade and tea refills and Ron continues.

#### **Heard Nature Photographers**

Ron joined the Heard Nature Photographers Club in 2004. As a member he has produced monthly slide shows, held the offices of President, Treasurer and Field Trip Coordinator. He has been Photographer of the Month. In 2011 he was awarded Lifetime Membership for the service he has provided to the club. He has won the "Members Choice Award" at the Heard 3 consecutive years in a row and won 89 photographic awards since 2005. Over the years he has presented several programs, led countless field trips, taught classes and mentored other photographers.

Member Jackie Ranney remembers that Ron was in charge of the Heard Nature Photographer's field trips for about ten years and he loved every minute of it (and so did everyone else). She says her favorite of all of them was our trip to White Sands in 2016. Not only did he work with the national park staff to get us early entry but we were there well before sunrise. Ron was up and down those hills like they were flat ground and knew exactly where to take us. In addition to his own shooting, he took the time to help anyone who wasn't sure what they were doing yet with the lighting and the environment!

Ron loved the mountains of Colorado, the Aspens in Utah, the crystal lakes of Canada, Death Valley, Big Sur, Monument Valley, Yosemite, Nova Scotia, Acadia National Park and many more, but his favorite also has been White Sands National Park. He has photographed there many times. In the March 2021 Issue of the Heard Nature Photographers Newsletter Ron gives detailed advice on when to go, what equipment to take, precautions in the wilderness, the best Mexican food nearby, but most important: where to go to photograph. He says: "Go out at least 3 dunes from the road in order to eliminate foot prints from your images." Good advice from a master.

#### Roaming Mexico: Laura Wilson

on exhibit September 14, 2025 - January 11, 2026

For four decades, the wilds of the American West have served as a key source of inspiration for renowned Dallas-based documentary photographer Laura Wilson (b. 1939). Her images of the people living and working "out west" ("out" meaning removed from modern American life) on ranches, Native American reservations, rodeos, and rural high schools are intimate yet distant. Indeed, as ever, the West is populated with characters defined by their distance, by their landscapes and lifeways that stand in sharp contrast to the familiar claustrophobia of urban and suburban America. There is, likewise, a kind of otherworldliness to Wilson's West; it is a marginal (if nested) place. Her images reside "on the edge," to paraphrase the renowned historian of medieval art Michael Camille, and we imagine the person behind the lens herself straddling the boundary between outsider and insider in a foreign land.

Dallas Camera Club (DCC) was organized in 1934 by 52 printmakers meeting twice a month to improve their photographic skills. Color slides were added, presumably in the 1940s, and color print competitions were added in 1970. In 1998, images from digital files were first accepted into DCC competitions. In 2005, slides were combined with projected digital images to create the projected images category. Slides were eliminated in 2008. Club competitions are now focused on color prints, monochrome prints and digital projected images.


The objective of the club is "the mutual entertainment and education of its members in all forms of amateur photographic art." The DCC hosts contests and events including monthly competitions, field trips, workshops, programs of general interest, an awards banquet and an annual competition (the "Bird") between DCC and Fort Worth Camera Club members. The DCC emphasizes intra-club competition as a learning process. Importance is placed on helping the beginner or new member feel at ease, ask questions, learn and participate.
