Birders' Paradise

Down in the valley you'll find a birder's paradise. About 360 species of birds have been reported at Bentsen-Rio Grande Valley State Park, along with butterflies, javelinas, bobcats and more!

Things to Do

Nature is the main attraction here.

[Look for birds](#) and other wildlife, get some exercise, and see the Rio Grande Valley in its near natural state. Stop by our Exhibit Hall to enjoy the bilingual (English/Spanish) exhibits.

To protect the natural environment, we do not allow cars in the park. Leave your car at headquarters and explore on [foot, bike](#) or take a [tram tour](#).

Reserve one of our [primitive campsites](#) (restrooms with showers are in the park). Book our 60-person [group hall](#) for your next gathering.

Look for birds

The park's woodlands and brushlands provide habitat for a wide variety of birds (and other wildlife). Look for them along our trails or at our viewing stations, water features and the two-story, wheelchair-accessible [Hawk Observation Tower](#).

About 360 bird species have been recorded in the park. These include subtropical species common in eastern Mexico, such as the Plain Chachalaca, Great Kiskadee and Altamira Oriole. The park is also a stopover for migratory birds, including Swainson's and Broad-winged hawks.

Thousands of hawks stream overhead in spring and fall as they migrate. You'll want to migrate to the Hawk Observation Tower for the best view - of the raptors, the tree canopy and Mexico.

Bring your binoculars or rent a pair from the park store. You'll need them to fully appreciate the wildlife you'll see here.

BEFORE YOU VISIT

Before you visit the National Butterfly Center, here are a few things you should know:

1) We are NOT a national park, state park, or public property supported by taxpayer dollars. For this reason, your "park pass" is not valid here. We are a nonprofit organization that relies upon admission fees, programs, plant and gift shop sales, and donations to fund operations.

2) We are NOT a butterfly house. We are a 100-acre nature center planted for butterflies, so they are all outside and free-flying. Come prepared to walk earthen trails, deal with the weather and look for birds, butterflies and other wildlife in their native habitat.

3) Mother Nature controls the seasons, regulates the plants and determines the volume of butterflies in flight at any given time of year--NOT us. For this reason, drought, cold and cloudy weather, rain, high winds and other natural phenomena will affect the number of species and individual butterflies present.

Estero Llano Grande State Park

- **Birding**

- The park attracts a wide variety of birds, due to its habitats and its location; about 340 species have been documented here!

- We are part of the World Birding Center, a series of sites in the Lower Rio Grande Valley protecting wildlife habitat.
- **Indigo Blind:** Catch a glimpse of some of the park's more secretive birds at the Indigo Blind. It's tucked into an area of the park known as the Tropical Zone, among native trees and tropical non-native fruit trees planted by a previous owner. The blind is ADA accessible and includes a water feature. We fill a feeding station during winter months. Look for forest birds such as [Green Jays](#), [White-tipped Doves](#) and [Altamira Orioles](#).

- **Trails**

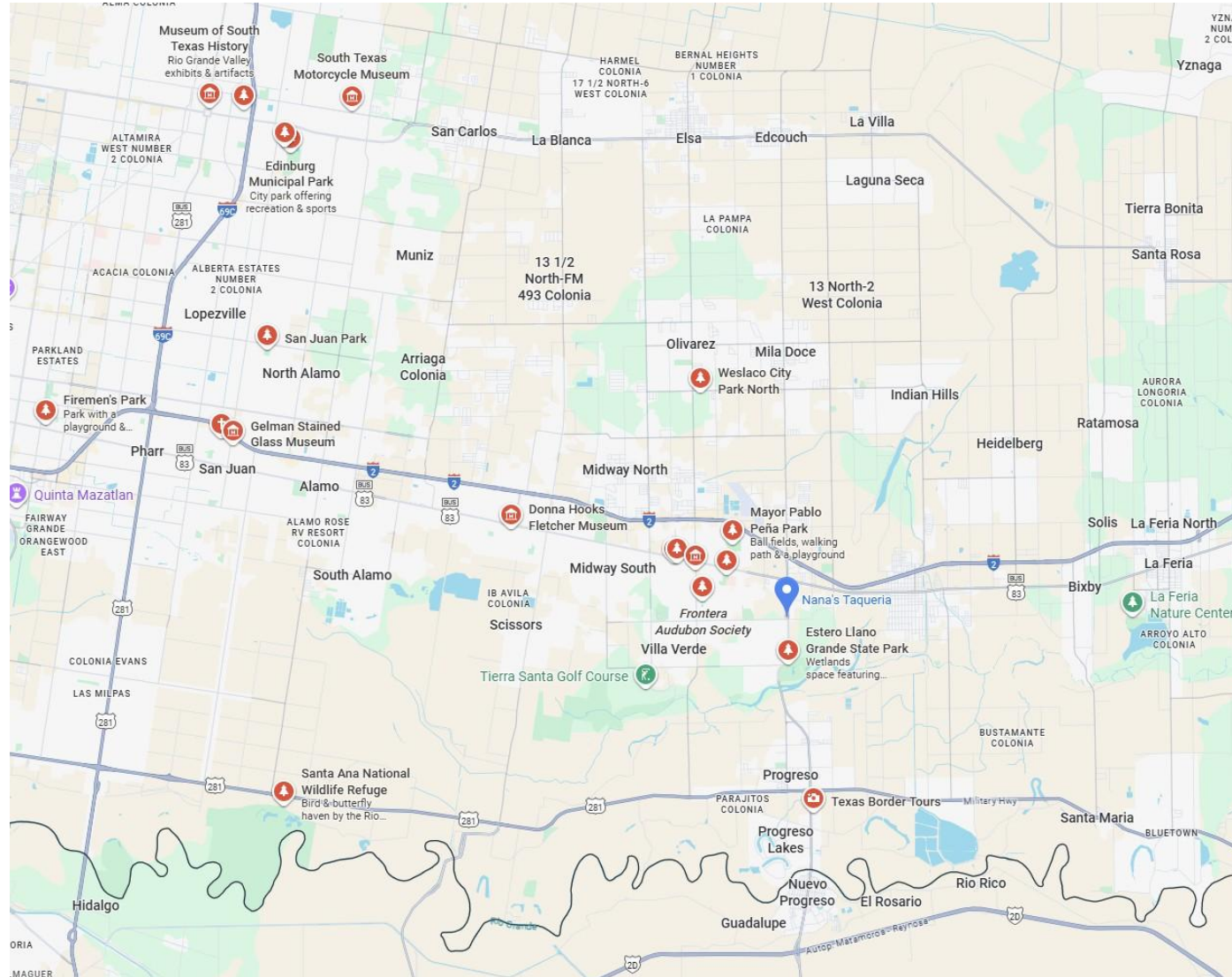
- Explore wetlands, ponds, woodlands and thorn scrub on more than [5 miles of trails](#). About 2 miles of trail are wheelchair accessible.
- We have several all-terrain wheelchairs for use in the park. Visit our [Accessibility Information page](#) for to learn more.
- [Be safe on the trails](#), no matter how you access them. Bring plenty of water and travel with a partner.

- **Nature watching**

- Nature takes center stage here. Walk the trails or sit quietly on a deck and take in the show!
- Alligator Lake is home to a few American alligators. Even if you don't see an alligator, you may see other animals as you walk through wetlands and brushy areas. Look for Common Pauraque, [White-tailed Kite](#) and our wetland birds. You might even see one of our resident [bobcats](#)!

Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge

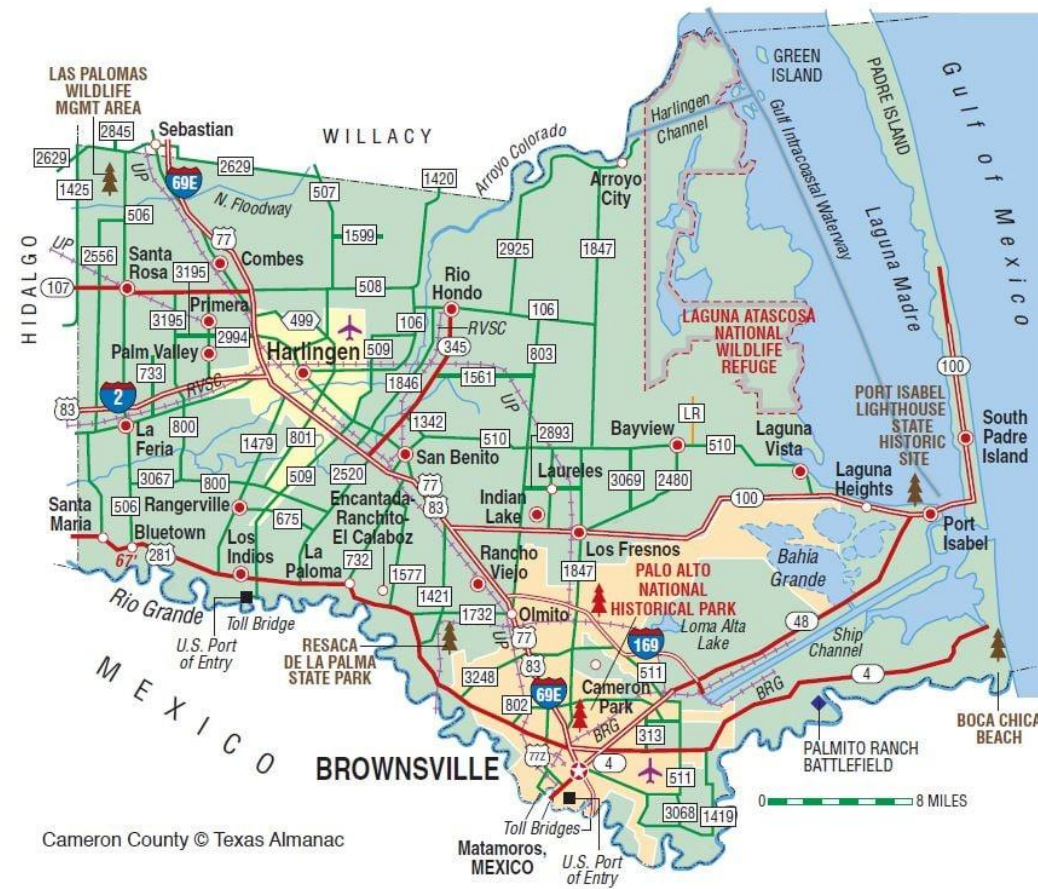
- **Our Species**

- Santa Ana National Wildlife Refuge is home to resident species like green jays, chachalacas and great kiskadees, making it one of the top birding destinations in the world. Some of the rarest raptors at the refuge are the hook-billed kite and gray hawk. Spring warblers are abundant with more than 35 species seen, including golden-winged warbler, magnolia warbler, northern and tropical parula, American redstart, palm warbler and yellow-breasted chat. Zebra longwings, Julias, and Mexican bluewings are but a few of the more than 300 butterfly species can also be found on the refuge.

BAT WATCHING IN MISSION

- Bats are common in Mission, TX, especially the resourceful [Mexican free-tailed bat](#), using highway culverts and palm trees as roosts, with notable sightings near the **Expressway 83 Conway Street exit**, forming significant, though often hidden, local populations alongside other Texas species like the Big Brown Bat and [Evening Bat](#), offering pest control benefits.

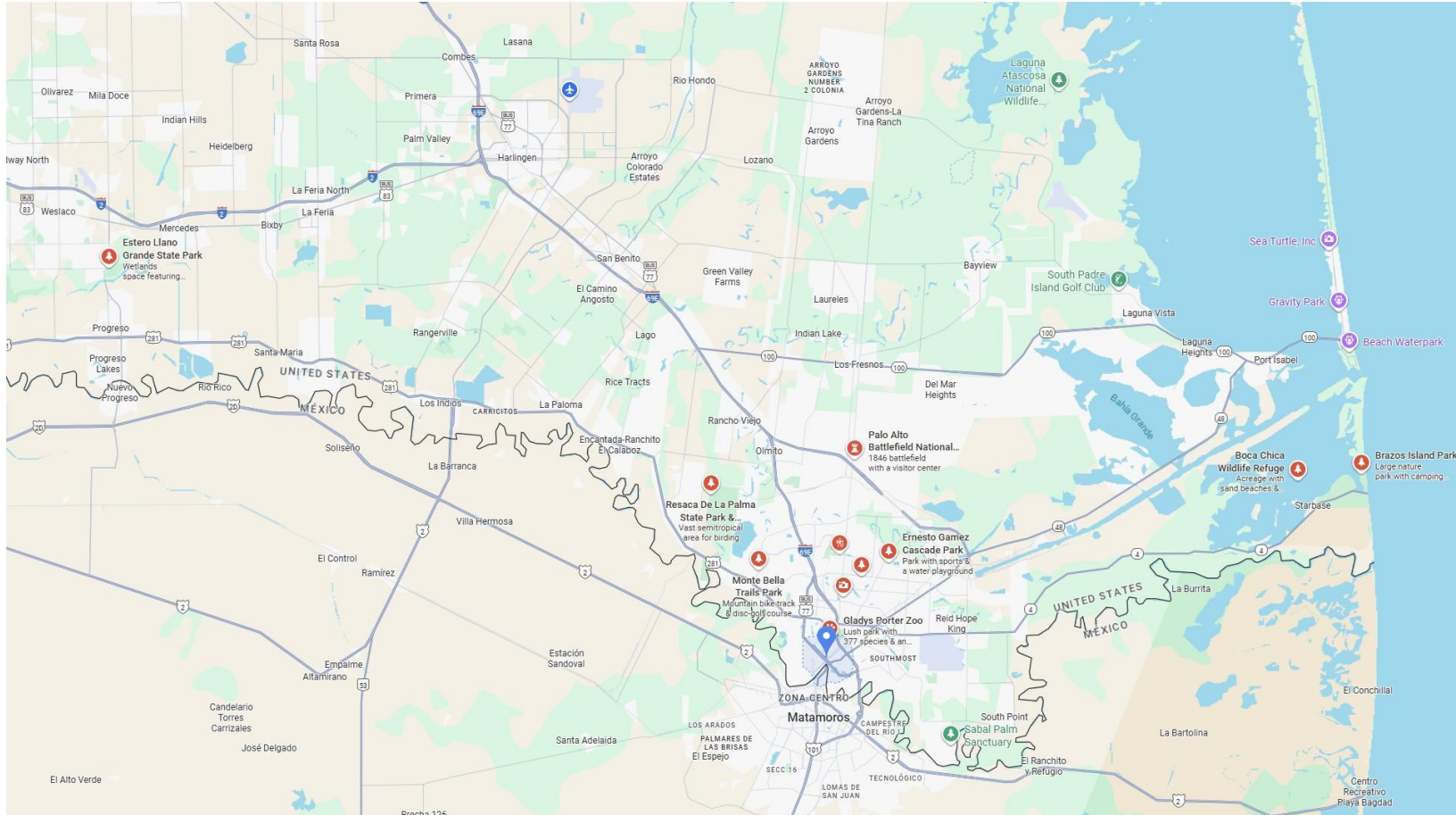
LAGUNA ATASCOSA NWR

- Laguna Atascosa National Wildlife Refuge was established in 1946 to provide habitat for wintering waterfowl and other migratory birds, principally redhead ducks. Today, there is an expanded emphasis that includes endangered species conservation and management for shorebirds. The refuge is a premiere bird-watching destination with more recorded species of birds than any other refuge in the National Wildlife Refuge System. The largest population of ocelots in the United States calls the refuge home, making it the center for conservation and recovery efforts for this endangered cat.
- Laguna Atascosa National Wildlife Refuge encompasses more than 120,000 acres, a portion of which are open to the public for wildlife related activities like wildlife watching, hunting, fishing, photography and environmental education.
