## Focal Point: President's Message

### About Ernest and Ansel The Al Brothers

We live in an ever-changing world, and little is changing faster than Artificial Intelligence (AI). We are just beginning to feel and see the impact of this technology. I will tell you about my encounters with the brothers Ernest and Ansel and how I am going to use their abilities and how I will not use them. (As an aside, when

the power goes off this summer, remember the marvels of AI come at the cost of massive power consumption and that the AI companies are buying that power at a very low rate.)

Ernest AI is named in honor of Ernst Hemingway. But he could have named him after any of the millions of writers and ordinary people whose writings were taken from the internet to train him. This is how all AI are trained, by feeding them massive amounts of data. I used Microsoft's AI Copilot to generate

the May and June President's message. In May, I took the text from Jim Walsh's May 2023 message and fed it to the Copilot asked for it to be rewritten in a humorous tone. The returned text stunned me, it was so fast and so well done. For June I fed the Copilot the outline for the speech I am giving at the 90th Anniversary Celebration. Again, it did an outstanding job even though it used some words that my wife said I have never used in my life. But I did a little editing, and I was all set. I identified both of those as having been written by an AI from material I provided.

Will I use this in the future? Yes. By using it I can see how my own writing can be improved to be more impactful. Over time I see it as a teacher, not a crutch. I would never use the tool in a professional scenario and I will always identify the part AI played in the document.

Now to the equally competent but more troubling Ansel AI. Ansel is named for a famous photographer as a stand-in for all the photographers whose images were used to train him. It is built in Adobe's Firefly AI. Ansel is used in the Generative Remove tool in Adobe Lightroom and Adobe Camera Raw. The remove panel offers several ways to remove blemishes and unwanted items. Clone takes pixels from one area of your photograph and exactly overwrites the pixels which are to be removed. Heal takes pixels from another area of your photograph and blends them with the problem area and often provides a better result. These have always been available and have been improved over time. Adobe recently

added Content Aware Remove which worked with your pixels to repair areas. It is very good. I have never had an issue with these three methods since they use my pixels from my material.

Then Adobe added Remove with Generative AI which removes spots and objects using Generative AI by (Adobe) Firefly and fills the selection with generated content. It works like magic in some cases and gives results that could never be obtained using the other tools. But the tool uses content generated from its database of other people's work. Our club rules and the rules of GSCCC and PSA clearly say something to the effect "All elements of the final image and any digital manipulation performed on such images must be totally of the submitter's own creative efforts and may not embody, in any form, digital imagery derived from other sources."

Additionally Adobe may attach or publish Content Credentials for content created with generative AI features to let people know it was generated with AI. After Generative AI is in final form and no longer early access the Content Credentials will be attached to all images using the generative features and this will lead to immediate disqualification in some photography contests and shows. (Content Credentials are not checked by the club.)

I am in a quandary with this feature. It works so well I want to use it, but I am not comfortable using it in club contests. Maybe this will change when I know more and there is more clarity in the photography world. For now, these are my personal guidelines - they are not club guidelines.

- Always understand and abide by the rules of the organization sponsoring a photography contest or exhibit.
- Use any method I choose for my personal photography.
- If I am unclear, I will label my photograph as containing generative material.

We should all carefully consider the wonders AI may bring and remember to be in control. Never forget Skynet.

July Field Trip: Bicycle Races in Richardson

If you are looking for a photographic opportunity where colorful subjects come to you, "Tuesday Night Crits" is it! What is a "crit" (short for criterium) you ask? In bicycle racing a "criterium" is a multi-lap race around a circular course (Learning the Cycling Skills for Your First Criterium | USA Cycling).

This means that once you pick your vantage point, you just wait for the riders to come by while you snap away. What could be simpler? There should be four races matching riders of various skill and experience levels.

Races can have as many as 75 to 100 riders (not that many the evening I went) and last for about 30-45 minutes each. You will not need a long lens, but a fast shutter speed will come in handy to stop the action. A slow shutter is worth trying to capture the blur of riders flashing by as well. Bring a lawn chair, find some good spot to sit, stay hydrated, and have fun.

Pick up sports photography tips and tricks while hearing and viewing behind-thescene stories from longtime sports photographer.

### **Biography**

Tom Fox is a Sr. Visual Journalist for *The Dallas Morning News*.

As a photojournalist, Tom has spent over 30 years experiencing the lives of others and sharing their stories through the lens of a camera. Along the way, he's had the privilege of working on many stories from Arlington to South Africa



from the plight of sick orphan Texas children being denied healthcare to the World Series Texas Rangers champions.

In that time, Tom was part of a small team of photographers at The Dallas Morning News who won the 2006 Pulitzer Prize for Breaking News Photography for coverage of Hurricane Katrina

He was also a 2020 Pulitzer Prize finalist in Spot News Photography for coverage of an active shooter outside Dallas' Earle Cabell Federal Building, which houses federal courts. He photographed the ordeal at great personal risk. The series of photos were shown at the 32nd International Festival of Photojournalism ("Visa pour l'image) in Perpignan, France.

In 2022, Festival della Fotografia Etica (Italy) recognized his photo from a Dallas courtroom wedding with the World Report Award's Single Shot of the Year.

Back stateside, the National Headliner Awards honored him with Best of Show (2018 and 2020) for his first place photography portfolio.

# **Storyboard:** *Citiscapes*Anita Oakley shares: Get out of your comfort zone

I love landscapes and wildlife, and I've devoted the largest part of my photographic energy toward them for the last 25 years. But sometimes it's good to get outside your comfort zone and shoot something entirely different.

This year I signed up for Mike Mezeul's Netherlands and Belgium workshop with my friend and fellow photographer, Terree Stone. It didn't work out quite the way I had envisioned as I missed several days with a medical issue, yet I learned a lot and want to do more city photography in the near future. Here are a few tips for you if you are similarly inclined:

- Tell a story. Look for those wide sweeping shots, yes, but then look for more detailed images that focus in on part of the scene.
- Look for reflections they are everywhere in the city. Everything from lights reflected on wet streets, to puddles in the street, to reflections in windows can create a compelling scene.
- Incorporate people into the scene. Use people walking in front of an interesting store front, or blurred images of people in a public square. After all, cities are about the people who inhabit them.

# **Storyboard:** *Citiscapes*Anita Oakley shares: Get out of your comfort zone

- Look for leading lines. They provide depth and interest. Streets are an easy option, but so are car trails, stairways, bridges, and more.
- Look for frames an arch that frames the scene in the distance, trees that frame a church building, an alley that frames people walking past.
- Change lenses. Citiscapes cry for a wide angle lens, but don't forget your mid-range lenses and telephotos. Mid-range lenses are great for street photography and highlighting the smaller scenes. Telephotos give you compression. A crowded street scene through a telephoto lens emphasises the sea of humanity you find in large cities.
- Don't quit when the sun goes down. Blue hour and nighttime in the city can be magic. Consider the two shots at the right: Same scene, but at night it has a much more intimate feeling.
- Don't underestimate the power of motion blur. A sharp city scene with blurred clouds can be nice. So can blur in vehicles passing by. or people walking around a square, as I mentioned before.
- Go out when the weather is less than ideal. This is every bit as true for citiscapes as it is for landscapes. Think fog, rain, snow. And if lightning hits in front and behind you - get indoors where it's safer.
- Consider black and white. In the first place, that extends your shooting time into midday. Secondly, some city scenes have good contrast, but little color. Think about converting them to monochrome.
- Use a tripod. Much of the time you will be shooting in lower light conditions. Nothing is as likely to ruin your shots as an unsteady camera. Yes, I know image stabilization has come a long way, but city scenes are unforgiving unless your focus is tack sharp.
- Stay safe. Be aware of what's going on around you. You are carrying thousands of dollars in your backpack. That can be pretty tempting for less than scrupulous people. Don't set your bag on the ground and walk away from it. Better yet, use a sling bag that you can keep on your person. There's safety in numbers, too. Take a friend and watch out for each other!

• Reducing frustration and setting yourself up for success. Master your camera system. Develop your fieldcraft. Know what ISO and shutter speed you need for the situation. Learn to recognize when your surroundings will make a great image. Don't get frustrated if things don't work out. Frustration just takes the joy out of the trip for you and for your companions. Trust Lee (and me) you are going to miss more shots than you get, and that's OK.

Revel in the images you love and don't sweat the small stuff!



other notable figures in the arts. Muray was a pioneer in color photography advertising. Ladies Home Journal produced the first natural color advertising photograph in 1931, Muray's grand Miami image of a swimming pool with 17 models in swimwear. He was a master printer, using the three-color carbon printing process, revealing deeply saturated color, which became a signature of his photographs.

Muray met Frida in Mexico through their mutual friend, the artist, Miguel Covarrubias. Nick and Frida became lovers for the next ten years, resulting in some of the most important photographic portraits of Frida ever taken. Some of these iconic images will be featured in this exhibition.



## Blast From the Past: Fireworks - How and Where

Previously published in the July 2001 issue of *Thru The Lens* 

As we celebrate the Dallas Camera Club's 90th Anniversary. Thru The Lens continues to showcase articles from past issues each month. The article below is published verbatim at right with the exception of updated dates and locations for this year's 4th of July fireworks displays.

### Happy shooting!



FIREWORKS - HOW AND WHERE was previously published in the July 2001 Thru The Lens issue. This article is shared more for a historical perspective of how far photographic equipment has evolved, yet even today regardless of whether film or digital cameras are used, most of the same settings and techniques to shoot fireworks still apply.

The new crop of computerized, auto-exposure, autofocus cameras assist photographers in virtually every phase of capturing an image. In many cases, all the photographer has to do is compose the image; the camera does the rest.

Shooting fireworks, however, brings the photographer back to the basics. Auto-focus and autoexposure have little benefit when capturing fireworks on film.

Kodak, in the Pocket Photoguide, recommends the following for great fireworks images:

- 1. Use a tripod.
- 2. Use an appropriate lens opening for your film. ISO 100: f/8; ISO 200: f/11; ISO 400: f/16
- 3. Use a shutter speed of B (bulb) and a remote shutter release. Open the shutter at the moment of explosion, and hold it open while the fireworks burst decays.
- 4. Capture multiple bursts on one frame. If your camera is not capable multiple exposures on one film frame, you can achieve the same results by opening the shutter with a remote release with the lens cap in place. Carefully remove the lens cap to capture a burst. Replace the lens cap once you have captured the firework
- 5. On auto-focus cameras, set focus to manual and focus at infinity, to prevent the camera's focusing system from "hunting" against the night sky.

A number of fireworks displays can be found around the Metroplex this Independence Day weekend. Please note that the times listed below are approximate.

Dallas Camera Club (DCC) was organized in 1934 by 52 printmakers meeting twice a month to improve their photographic skills. Color slides were added, presumably in the 1940s, and color print competitions were added in 1970. In 1998, images from digital files were first accepted into DCC competitions. In 2005, slides were combined with projected digital images to create the projected images category. Slides were eliminated in 2008. Club competitions are now focused on color prints, monochrome prints and digital projected images.


The objective of the club is "the mutual entertainment and education of its members in all forms of amateur photographic art." The DCC hosts contests and events including monthly competitions, field trips, workshops, programs of general interest, an awards banquet and an annual competition (the "Bird") between DCC and Fort Worth Camera Club members. The DCC emphasizes intra-club competition as a learning process. Importance is placed on helping the beginner or new member feel at ease, ask questions, learn and participate.


