President's Message by Dennis Fritsche

About Workshops by Dennis Fritsche

As you breathlessly read the article in the September about the two workshops I attended in 2023, you probably asked yourself, "Does Dennis have any words of wisdom about workshops?" You will be surprised to hear that I do indeed have some words – whether they are wise or not, you will have to decide.



My recent workshop to the Olympic Peninsula was by <u>Visionary Wild</u>. They are expensive but the price includes lodging and food and beverages. The workshop "Fall in Yosemite" was arranged by the leader, William Neill. See Workshops and Mentoring at his <u>website</u>.

I have taken classes from the Ansel Adams Galley in Yosemite. These can be especially fun because the classroom sessions take place in Ansel Adams' teaching darkroom. And you are in Yosemite. <u>The Ansel Adams Gallery</u> Photography Workshops

And <u>Santa Fe Workshops</u>. They offer online, live in Santa Fe, and live on locations. I took my first workshop through Santa Fe with David Middleton in the Olympic Peninsula. If you like travel photography to exotic places, a local photographer, Jeremy Woodhouse, leads adventurous workshops available at <u>Pixelchrome Photo Tours</u>

Also, locally and attended by many in the club is Mike Mezeul. Mike Mezeul II Photography

There are many types of workshops, and it is important to align what you want with what the workshop offers.

- A location workshop is one in which the leader gets you to photogenic locations. The leader is likely to be taking photos for his own portfolio and you are pretty much on your own. There is value in this type if you are proficient and don't need instruction and you just want someone who knows where to go.
- Location and instruction workshops usually combine a morning and afternoon shoot with instruction during mid-day. Often you are asked to bring a portfolio of about ten prints for the leaders to evaluate and comment on. Workshops with evaluations are very helpful.
- Instructional workshop are heavy on classroom instruction and may be live or online and may or may not have location shooting.

I have been on some of each type and have enjoyed most of them for what they are.

My criterion for choosing a workshop is the instructor. The Olympic workshop I just finished was with <u>Michael Frye</u> – someone I have wanted to have a workshop with for years. The Yosemite workshop with the renown photographer, William Neill. I prefer smaller groups such as eight or ten. Instructor feedback is very valuable and helpful. Burned in my brain is what the great black and white photographer, John Sexton, said about my portfolio during a workshop lead by he and Charles Crammer. "Dennis, these are not very photographic." After hearing that critique, I changed how I process my images and have been chasing that *photographic image* ever since.

OCTOBER FIELD TRIP

WHAT: Great Smoky Mountain National Park area WHEN: October 27 - November 1, 2024 WHERE: Townsend and surroundings, NC

Our fall color trip will be to Great Smoky Mountains NP (Great Smoky Mountains National Park (U.S. National Park Service) (nps.gov) during the last week of October. For this adventure our home base will be Townsend, Tennessee (Townsend, Tennessee Welcome to the Peaceful Side of the Smokies (exploretownsend. com)). Please save the dates and make plans to join us on what should be two outstanding adventures.

The Great Smoky Mountains NP is free to visit; however, a parking fee of \$15 for a week has been instituted if you plan to park for more than 15 minutes at any location. The park's website gives a lot of information and is where you can purchase the parking pass. The website gives alerts of road closures and notifications of buildings which may be undergoing renovation.

As the field trip plans to be based in Townsend, TN, its location is at the northwestern side of the park; so, for some on the field trip, Cade's Cove may be their introduction to what the park offers. The primary access to Cades Cove is the 11-mile, one-way Cades Cove Loop Road. It is a narrow road along which are found log cabins and barns, old churches, and the Cable Mill Historic Area and Visitor Center.

As you drive the loop, on your left for most of the way will be an open large meadow area that would have been plowed fields in times past. If lucky, a bear may be spotted. Most definitely deer and wild turkeys are seen. Occasionally, I have heard that elk have been seen. It is also the area to see the lone tree growing with meadow around it.

There are numerous waterfalls in the park. Do research to locate them. If you like to hike, you will enjoy the trip in and out to visit one.

Located just outside Gatlinburg, Roaring Fork Motor Trail is a 6-mile one-way one-lane scenic drive with a few historic log cabins and the trail heads to a couple of waterfalls. These cabins photographed with fall color or dogwoods in the spring make captivating images which are seen in galleries.

If you want to photograph elk, a very good place is in a large field next to the Oconaluftee Visitor Center and Mountain Farm Museum. People will park along the park road to watch and photograph the elk. Park rangers and volunteers will tell you to stay on the side of your car opposite the field. Some elk can be remarkably close to you. Early morning or late evening is the best time to see them. Note: The park roads are two lane mountain roads with the usual twists and turns. Plan extra time to reach a location. Also, start early before the tourists finish breakfast and head into the park.

If you venture over to photograph Roaring Fork Motor Trail, you may want to have lunch or dinner in Gatlinburg as you will be on the outskirts of the town. A glorified tourist village with gift, souvenir shops, and amusement venues. There are craft shops and artist shops as well. Pedestrians rule the main street through town. There are many restaurants It is a place where one visit in your lifetime is enough but may be worth it to say you have been there.

Next Month's Program: Clinton Kemp - November 26, 2024 "My Eye for Color"

Clinton Kemp will present "*My Eye for Color*" at the November 26th meeting. He will share his favorite photos and discuss how color influences the images he is drawn to make as well as how he feels it impacts his post-processing decisions. His presentation will include photography from his wide variety of photographic interests including landscapes, cityscapes, birds / wildlife, intentional camera movement, photojournalism, street / portraits as well as night and astrophotography.



Color and color contrast are powerful elements in photography. Color can be used to evoke emotions, moods and feelings. It can also draw attention to specific subjects and create depth and dimension. Over the past 5 years competing in Dallas Camera Club, Clinton has come to realize just how much color plays a role in his photography. He will discuss how he tends to seek out subject matter with vibrant or complementary colors (those opposite on the color wheel) and to a lesser extent analogous and monochromatic colors. He has also recognized that color has influenced the places he has decided to travel to for photography. He feels the vibrant colors of San Miguel de Allende, the geothermal pools in Yellowstone, the warm colored terrain of the US Southwest, and colors of Italy and Iceland in autumn made them some of his favorite places to capture. And it's the reason other colorful places like Greece, India, Morocco, Cuba, Cinque Terre, the Lofoten islands and Namibia remain on his travel bucket list.

Clinton grew up in Victoria, Texas. After earning a Bachelor of Fine Arts in advertising design and photography from Stephen F. Austin University, he moved to Dallas and soon after started a graphic design, marketing and print brokering business in 1995. Being self-employed for almost

30 years has afforded him a lot of freedom and opportunities to fulfill his love of travel and photography. He is thankful that he's been able to visit 23 countries, all while traveling on a budget. Clinton prides himself in doing what he can to stretch his travel dollars by taking advantage of deals, loyalty points and air miles.

Clinton joined the Dallas Camera Club in 2019 and has thoroughly enjoyed benefiting from the excellent virtual and live training opportunities the club offers. He has also enjoyed getting to know so many others who share the photography bug. DCC is the reason he purchased an Epson P800 printer and where he learned how to properly make a print. Clinton was named a Fellow of the Dallas Camera Club in 2021. Last year he got more involved by serving as club secretary and helping *Thru The Lens* newsletter editor, Nancy Mack. As the club celebrates its 90th anniversary, he encourages others to consider stepping up and giving back to the club by serving on the Board as a project manager or officer.





Monument Valley is located on the border between Utah and Arizona. It is not a National Park or a National Monument. It is owned and operated by the Navajo Tribe. John Ford filmed Stagecoach there and he visited so much that they named a point after him.



Portraits of Frida includes extraordinary photographs of the celebrated painter, Frida Kahlo, by two artists, Lucienne Bloch and Nickolas Muray.

Lucienne Bloch (1909 – 1999, b. Geneva, Switzerland) met the married artist couple, Frida and Diego in 1932 when hired to work with the very notable painter, Diego Rivera, in Detroit. This project at the Detroit Institute of Art became the most important Diego Rivera mural in the United States.

Lucienne, Diego and Frida became fast friends. Some of Lucienne's portraits of Frida in Detroit will be included in this exhibition.

Nickolas Muray (1892 – 1965, b. Szeged, Hungary) was a successful commercial photographer and two-time Olympic fencer based in New York. He was known for his portraits of actors, playwrights, ballet dancers and other notable figures in the arts. Muray was a pioneer in color photography advertising. Ladies Home Journal produced the first natural color advertising photograph in 1931, Muray's grand Miami



image of a swimming pool with 17 models in swimwear. He was a master printer, using the threecolor carbon printing process, revealing deeply saturated color, which became a signature of his photographs.





Dallas Camera Club (DCC) was organized in 1934 by 52 printmakers meeting twice a month to improve their photographic skills. Color slides were added, presumably in the 1940s, and color print competitions were added in 1970. In 1998, images from digital files were first accepted into DCC competitions. In 2005, slides were combined with projected digital images to create the projected images category. Slides were eliminated in 2008. Club competitions are now focused on color prints, monochrome prints and digital projected images.

The objective of the club is "the mutual entertainment and education of its members in all forms of amateur photographic art." The DCC hosts contests and events including monthly competitions, field trips, workshops, programs of general interest, an awards banquet and an annual competition (the "Bird") between DCC and Fort Worth Camera Club members. The DCC emphasizes intra-club competition as a learning process. Importance is placed on helping the beginner or new member feel at ease, ask questions, learn and participate.


